Agriscience Fair Process of Entry & Interview Virtual

National FFA: The revisions for the 2025 ASF have been postponed until 2027 year. Nothing is changing for the 2025 year except there are no category determinations.

General Information

The state Agriscience Fair competition is completed virtually in early May. Awards are announced at the Kansas FFA Convention.

Entry Components:

- 1. Complete **online** registration Leadership Development Events hosted at state convention by the date designated in the Kansas FFA Calendar. (April 23, 2025)
 - When registering teams of two, please put both names in the same line under the appropriate category on the registration form.
 - Look for link on the **JudgingCard.com** online calendar dates May 12/13 (since that is when the interviews take place)

2. Application/Manuscript

- Use the "Agriscience Fair" award application to submit the application and manuscript on theAET.com via the Chapter Degree/Application Manager by April 30, 2025 (11:59 p.m.)
 - Must have all the electronic signatures
 - Students will log into their account to sign their name, the teacher must also sign their name to approve, and the "research supervisor" signs as well (who can also be the advisor)
 - Each person on a two-member team must have their own FFA member ID
- Cover page from the National FFA Agriscience application form.
- Written Report The report should be printed on 8 ½" x 11" white paper, 1" margins.
 Font Size must be 12 using Arial, Courier or Times New Roman font. The project report

template is required and is available on the National FFA website. Refer to the National FFA Agriscience Fair rules for more information.

3. Virtual Presentation Judging

- Conducted May 12 & May 13, 2025 (exact dates/times TBA)
- Student(s) will sign up for a designated time for a live Zoom session
- No displays/slides will be allowed during the interview. (National FFA no longer allows them.

Winning exhibitors will be recognized during the Kansas FFA Convention.

Other items to note:

- Each interview will be allowed 15 minutes total (but they do not have to take the entire time).
- The 15 minutes for each interview include the explanation and any questions from the judges.
- If the project is a team of two, both individuals must participate in the interview if they want to compete for the opportunity to advance to nationals.
- Students may only enter one individual project or one team project, not a project in each division.
